AHEAD and the National Disabled Postgraduates Advisory Committee would like to see more disabled people progressing to postgraduate study and careers in research. That's why we worked together to form the LaunchPAD Partnership, PAD standing for Postgraduate, Academia and Disability.

The attainment of a postgraduate qualification has been found to be a key indicator of a higher standard of living and a better quality of life. AHEAD research shows that people with disabilities reporting for only 3% of the total postgraduate population with many disabled people reporting barriers to the participation (Participation Rates, AHEAD 2023). The Higher Education Authority (HEA), in recognition of the low participation rates of disabled people at postgraduate level, established the inclusion of disabled students in postgraduate study as a national strategic objective, expressed under the inclusivity goal within the Strategic Action Plan for Equity of Access, Participation and Success in Higher Education 2022 – 2028.
